Advanced leadership training: Sea Badge: A nationally supervised weekend classroom program for experienced Sea Scouters that presents advanced management techniques.

Program specific training <u>required</u> for certification:

Venturing Youth Protection Training (Y02): An online program illustrating the techniques for meeting the challenges of working with teens and presents the rules for conducting activities.

Sea Scout Adult Leader Basic Training (P44): A classroom program for teaching the details of running a Sea Scout ship.

Sea Badge Underway: A nationally supervised weekend course held underway on a boat for experienced Sea Scouters that focuses on managing underway operations of a Sea Scout ship.

Wood Badge: An internationally recognized 6-day course in executive management techniques as applied to scouting.

Supplemental training useful to Sea Scout leaders:

Hazardous Weather: An online program teaching the techniques for recognizing hazardous weather and the guidelines for protection.

Safety Afloat (SA): An online program teaching the rules for conducing safe boating activities.

Safe Swim Defense (SSD): An online program teaching the rules for conducting safe aquatic activities.

Trainer's EDGE: A classroom program that teaches skills useful for instructors and educators.
